## Wintersweet

## MATERIALS:

## 74" x 74" Finished Quilt

1 Jelly Roll or $\underline{23} 2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips
4 yds neutral fabric for border blocks
$43 / 4 \mathrm{yds}$ fabric for backing
82" x 82" Cotton Batting
$3 / 4$ yd fabric for binding


Simply strip-piecing and inspired by a vintage textile, you'll treasure this quilt for many Christmases to come..

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Please read through the pattern before you begin, assuming a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance and a fabric width (WOF) of 42". I would always recommend making a test block.

## CUTTING:

1. Choose $\underline{6}$ red \& $\underline{\mathbf{7}}$ green Jelly Roll strips and cut $\underline{\mathbf{2}} 2^{1 / 2 " \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ pieces from each.
2. From your neutral* fabric cut $1941 / 2^{\prime \prime} x$ WOF strips and subcut into $11241 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ pieces, then cut $\underline{23} 2 \frac{112 " \prime}{} \times$ WOF strips and subcut $462 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ pieces.
3. From your binding fabric cut $8 \underline{2} 1^{1 / 2 \prime} \times$ WOF strips. If you like a scrappy binding you could use the red prints from the Jelly Roll.
*I replaced a few of my $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips with the cream prints from my Jelly Roll to give my quilt a scrappy, vintage look.

## PIECING THE STRIP SETS:

4. Strip-set A: Join a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ green strip to a $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ neutral strip, pressing away from the neutral strip and taking care to keep your sets straight.


MAKE 16 then subcut into $1282^{1 ⁄ 212}$ " sections.
5. Strip-set B: Join a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ green print strip - varying the prints - to each side of a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ neutral strip, pressing away from the centre and taking care to keep your sets straight.


MAKE $\underline{7}$ then subcut into $\underline{50} \mathbf{2}^{11 / 2 "}$ sections.
6. Strip-set C: Join a $21^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ neutral strip to each side of a $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ green strip, pressing towards the centre and taking care to keep your sets straight.


MAKE 4 then subcut into $\underline{25} 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sections.
7. Strip-set D: Join a $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ red print strip - varying the prints - to each side of a $2^{1 / 2 "} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ neutral strip, pressing away from centre and taking care to keep your sets straight.


MAKE $\underline{3}$ then subcut into $\underline{24} 2^{11 / 2 "}$ sections.
8. Strip-set E: Join a $21^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ neutral strip to each side of a $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}$ red strip, pressing towards the centre and taking care to keep your sets straight.


MAKE $\underline{6}$ then subcut into $482^{11 / 2 "}$ sections.

## ASSEMBLING THE FOUR-PATCH BLOCK:

9. Make the four-patch units by joining $\underline{\mathbf{2}} 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sections of strip-set A, mixing the prints, as shown right, pressing your seam to either side, or open if preferred.

## ASSEMBLING THE GREEN NINE-PATCH BLOCK:


10. Make the nine-patch units by joining a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ section of strip-set B to each side of a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ section of strip-set $C$, again mixing the prints, as shown left, nesting the seams and pressing in the direction of the arrows.

## ASSEMBLING THE RED NINE-PATCH BLOCK:

11. Make the nine-patch units by joining a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ section of strip-set $E$ to each side of a $21 / 2$ " section of strip-set D, mixing the prints as before, as shown left, nesting the seams and pressing in the direction of the arrows.

## ASSEMBLING THE QUILT:

12 Lay out your quilt blocks, as shown overleaf, alternating the pieced blocks with the $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ neutral pieces, then assemble the quilt top in rows. Press the seams away from the pieced blocks, so that the rows 'nest' nicely when they're joined together.
13. Cut your backing into two WOF x 82" pieces, trim off the selvages and join together using a $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ seam, pressed open. Trim to 82 " square.
14. Sandwich the batting between the backing and the quilt top, baste, then machine or hand quilt.

15. Join your binding strips end to end to form one long strip and press in half, wrong sides together, along its length. Trim away excess batting and background taking the opportunity to ensure your corners are square - and bind the raw edge using your preferred method \{and you can find my favourite method, listed under Tutorials, on my blog at cakestandquilts.com\}.

A Note About Quilting:


My cover quilt was hand-quilted in a combination of two of my favourite techniques: a crosshatch and a motif, in this case an intertwined heart motif.

The supersized crosshatching simply follows the diagonals formed by the nine and fourpatches. I then drew a cross with my watersoluble marker at the centre of the red ninepatches to help position the heart motif.
