

A delicate block in three sizes to adorn your spring projects...

To make each block you will need...

| 2" finished size | 4" finished size | $8^{\prime \prime}$ finished size |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| $1^{11 / 2 \prime \prime}$ yellow print square | $12^{1 / 2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ yellow print square | $14^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ yellow print square |
| $41^{\prime \prime} \times 11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ pink print pieces | $411 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ pink print pieces | $421 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ pink print pieces |
| $\underline{4} 11 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and $\underline{4}^{1 \prime \prime}$ neutral sqs | $42^{\prime \prime}$ and $41^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ neutral sqs | $43^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ and $42^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ neutral sqs |

Please read through the pattern before you begin. Fabric is always placed right-sidestogether and joined with a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance unless otherwise noted.

## PIECING THE APPLE BLOSSOM BLOCK:

## Directions are given for the 2" finished size, with the 4 " and 8 " sizes in brackets.

1. First join a $1^{\prime \prime}\left(11 / 2^{\prime \prime} / 2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}\right)$ neutral square to each side of a $1^{\prime \prime} \times 11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mid\left(11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right.$ $/ 2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ ) pink print piece, pressing towards the pink.

## MAKE $\mathbf{2}$

2. Then join a $1^{\prime \prime} \times 1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}\left(1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} / 21^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime}\right)$ pink print piece to each side of a $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} / 4^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}\right)$ yellow print square, again pressing towards the pink.

## MAKE 1

3. Make a nine-patch unit by joining those three units together, pressing as directed (>).
4. Mark a diagonal line on the back of a $1 \frac{1}{4 \prime \prime}\left(2^{\prime \prime} / 3^{1 / 2 \prime}\right)$ neutral square and place right-sides down on a corner of the nine-patch. Stitch on the line then press open to snowball the corner - before trimming away the back layers. Repeat on the remaining corners to finish the blossom petals.

Your Apple Blossom block should measure $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(4^{1 / 2 \prime} / 8^{1 / 2 \prime 2}\right)$ square.


## IDEAS FOR USING YOUR APPLE BLOSSOM BLOCK:

You can add a touch of delicate Apple Blossom to quilts, zipper pouches and pincushions. By adding $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ matching borders to either the 4 " or $8^{\prime \prime}$ blocks - creating $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ or $12^{1 / 2 "}$ square unfinished blocks - you can use them to make a cute gift bag or larger tote bag with my blog tutorial, posted on the $13^{\text {th }}$ of December, 2018.

Or make a new cushion with $\underline{3} 4$ " blocks, by joining them in a row with $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ stashing pieces...


Then add $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 141 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ borders to the top and bottom, then to each side to make a $14^{1 / 2 "} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ cushion front. Finish the cushion by following my Festival Cushion tutorial, posted on the $7^{\text {th }}$ of November, 2017 (steps 5-11).
